# AUCTION RULES



## How to Bid

All guests will be assigned a bid number at registration. Only registered bidders can participate in the auction process. To bid during the silent auction, write your bidder number next to the amount you would like to offer on the bid sheet. Anything less than the minimum bid is void. The last bid at closing time constitutes the winning bid, except if a guaranteed bid has already been placed on the item. The “Guaranteed Bid Box” on the silent auction form ensures you ownership of that item. When you enter your number in the Guaranteed Bid Box, you have won that item for the amount specified. The closing bids will be certified by an auction staff person. No bids entered after the closing time will be honored. To bid during the live auction, simply hold your bid number high until the auctioneer acknowledges your bid. When no more bids are offered, the last bid acknowledged has won the item.

## If You Win

All sales are final and there will be no exchange or refund on items except where specified. Please make payment in full this evening. We accept check, Visa and MasterCard. Auction items may only be removed from the premises by either an auction staff or by showing a paid receipt that confirms your purchase of the item(s). Before leaving, make sure you have everything that you paid for.

## Invoices & Early Checkout

If paying by credit card, you will receive a preliminary invoice the night of the auction, your card will be charged the week after the auction and the final receipt will be mailed to you. Please note: For those wanting to check out early (prior to the end of the live auction), we MUST have a completed Quick Check form. Your invoice total may not be available if you choose early checkout, but will be included in the mailed receipt.

## Merchandise Pickup

All purchased items must be removed from the auction site the night of the auction. Any items left unclaimed will be stored at the buyer's expense unless other arrangements have been previously made with an auction committee member.

## Liability & Item Descriptions

Monroe Montessori PBC Auction Committee Members have made every effort to describe and catalog all items appropriately, but all items are sold “as-is”. Auction Committee Members neither warrant, nor guarantee item details, descriptions, authorship, provenance or other specifics. Bidders may request additional information before or during actual bidding. Values for some items are estimates and many have restriction and expiration dates.

## Information Regarding Redemption of Items

Unless otherwise specified all auction items and services must be used within one year from date of purchase at the auction. Other restrictions may apply. Read catalog descriptions carefully and listen for announcements by the auctioneer regarding item details or limitations. Many service related items require the purchaser to schedule redemption at a mutually agreeable date and/or time. Hotel stays and other accommodations also may require advance booking of more than one month. No refunds will be allowed on items for lack of space, ability to redeem, cancellation, etc.

## Tax Deduction

For tax purposes, the value for the meal is estimated at \$25 per person. Your payments for (a portion of) tickets and items may be deductible as a charitable contribution only to the extent provided by law. ## UNIQUE TREASURES



### Centerpieces

All our beautiful centerpieces were provided by David Smith. David Smith was introduced to the art of glass blowing in 1978 while studying for a degree in Materials Science and Engineering at MIT. His final two years were spent in the Materials Artifacts Laboratory where he did analysis on man's earliest evidence of ceramic processing, the pigment used in cave paintings and worked on the project tracing the transfer of porcelain technology from China down the silk road to Europe. After graduation, in 1983, he returned to Seattle and started working full-time as a glass blower.

In 1987, he bought a one-way ticket to China and then traveled across Asia and the Soviet Union. He spent the next 5 years living and working with artists in Finland, Germany, France and Ireland. He returned to Seattle and established his own studio/hot-shop in Ballard. His art glass has been collected and appreciated around the world and his glass castings are installed in the Atlanta Federal Building as well as public and private buildings in the Northwest. His work is an extension of his technical background in glass science and his love of the traditions and history of glass blowing throughout the world.

### Teachers List display

As you walk into the main event room on your right, you will see the animals gathered around the baobab tree.

According to Zambian creation myth when the Great Spirit made the world he gave each animal his own particular tree. The hyena got the baobab and threw it down in disgust, the tree landed the wrong way up with the roots sticking up like branches.

### 11. **MS HENDERSON'S CLASSROOM PROJECT**

The djembe (JEM-bay) is a goatskin-covered African hand drum shaped like a large goblet and is played with bare hands. The drum tradition ally comes from the Mali Empire of West Africa. It was originally used for ceremonial purposes, but is now used to unite communities and for entertainment.

This drum is carved from plantation grown mahogany, and has been decorated by the children of the upper elementary class. Each child chose an African symbol, then drew and painted it along with a back ground color onto the drum. Some chose the design for its meaning and others chose for the aesthetically pleasing design.

Accompanying the drum is a guide book (also made by the children) explaining each symbol's meaning. This lovely piece of artwork will be a beautiful addition to any nook or cranny.

Even the bark plays a part in daily life when it is soaked, pounded, and fashioned into rope, fishing nets and clothes.
